Cystic Fibrosis (CF) is the most common life threatening genetic condition in Australia—and there is no cure. CF is a degenerative condition that affects the body's systems, including the respiratory system (lungs), digestive system and the reproductive system.

From birth, a person with CF undergoes constant treatments and physiotherapy.

Why a Rose

"65 Roses" is what some children with CF call the disease because the words are much easier for them to pronounce. But, making it easier to say doesn't make CF easier to live with. The Rose has become the recognised symbol of Cystic Fibrosis around the world.

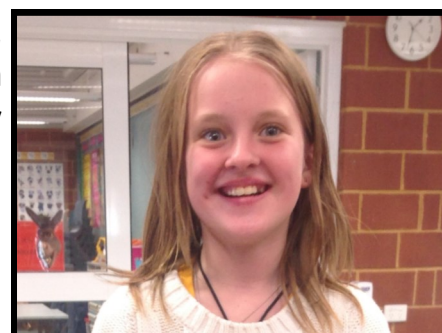
