



VOLUNTARY CONTRIBUTIONS

We will soon be sending out Statements for outstanding Voluntary Contributions.

In order to enrich the opportunities available to your child in school, the Department of Education under section 99 of the School Education Act 1999, permits schools to request that all parents/caregivers pay a voluntary contribution. The amount requested is determined in consultation with the School Board. Contributions for 2017 are set at a flat rate of \$50 per student from Kindergarten to Year 6. This amount has not changed for the last 5 years.

These funds are important if a school is to be able to budget effectively. Parents are requested to pay the contribution during the first two weeks of school. Other fees will be called for during the year for specific activities.

Payment can be made by either cash or cheque as the school does not have Eftpos or Credit card facilities.
